TRAFFIC-CONTROL DEVICES

11.04.010 Adoption of Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD).

The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD), as most recently amended, adopted by the Federal Highway Administrator as the national standard on all classes of highway open to public travel, is adopted as the standard for placement of traffic-control devices on all Whitman County roads open to public travel.

11.04.020 Delegation of duty to director of public works.

The director of public works (county engineer) is delegated the authority to erect, remove, and maintain as he deems appropriate upon county roads such suitable and proper signs, signals, signboards, guideposts, and other traffic devices according to the adopted MUTCD, RCW Ch. 46.61 and 36.86.040, and such other regulations that have been adopted with regard to traffic-control devices on county roads and shall proceed to carry out such duty.

11.04.030 Maintenance of inventory records.

The director of public works (county engineer) shall keep in his office, available for public inspection, an appropriate inventory of all regulatory signs, signals, signboards, guideposts, and other regulatory traffic devices placed by him in conformance with Section 11.04.020, said inventory to include the nature of each

traffic-control device and its physical location, including the location of all speed zones on county roads within the county.

11.04.050 Reward-Defacing, damaging or destroying county traffic-control devices.

The county board of commissioners is authorized to draw a warrant or warrants out of any money in the county treasury not otherwise appropriated, in an amount not to exceed five hundred dollars, as a reward to any person or persons providing information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person or persons who have defaced, damaged or destroyed any county traffic-control device.

SEVEN-DAY PARKING RESTRICTION

11.08.010 Seven-day parking restriction.

11.08.010 Seven-day parking restriction.

- A. A seven-day parking restriction shall be in effect on all land owned by the county.
- B. The county public works director shall have prepared signs of sufficient size and in sufficient quantity to post at all locations within the county and presently used for vehicle parking. The director shall also have the continuing obligation to post any parking areas on county property as they may in the future exist.
- C. The signs shall read as follows:

PARKING RESTRICTION

BY ORDER OF THE WHITMAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, ANY VEHICLE PARKED IN THIS LOT CONTINUOUSLY FOR MORE THAN SEVEN DAYS SHALL BE SUBJECT TO IMPOUNDMENT. IF YOUR VEHICLE HAS BEEN IMPOUNDED, YOU MAY CONTACT THE WHITMAN COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT AT 397-6266 FOR INFORMATION.
